WORDS TO USE:

Verbs: cut, sort, paste, wash, plant, grow, drink

Nouns: hands, flower, water, sun, glass

Adjectives: dirty, clean, full, empty

Concepts: sequencing: first, next, last

HOW TO PLAY:

- Print the page below.
- Cut out all the pictures.
- Sort the 'washing hands' pictures in order.
- Sort the 'flower' pictures in order.
- Sort the 'drink' pictures in order
 - There are numbers (1,2,3) in the top of each picture to help you sort.
 - You can paste the pictures in the correct order on a blank piece of paper.
- You may need to give extra help by pointing to the picture. Let them try first.

USE SENTENCES LIKE THESE:

- "What happens first?"
- "What happens next?"
- "What happens last?"
- "Great sorting! I can tell you are trying your best"
- "Well done, first the glass is full of water."
- "Next we give our plant water and sun to help it grow"

NOTE:

- You can talk about *first*, *next*, *last* when doing lots of activities at home like the dishes, colouring in, eating etc.
