

Colours – Treasure Hunt

TARGET VOCABULARY:

Verbs: find, look, bring, search

Nouns: colours – blue, red, green, yellow, purple, black, white, orange, pink, grey

Concepts: colours, following directions

HOW TO PLAY:

- Ask your child to tell you what the colours are on the cards below.
- Tell your child you are going to do a treasure hunt in the house to find colours.
- Follow the instructions on the sheet below. You can change this if your child needs more help – for example ask them to find one red thing instead of three red things.
- You can help your child by giving them clues to find the right colour.
- You can use the colour cards to remind your child what colour they are looking for.

WHEN PLAYING WITH THE CARDS USE SENTENCES LIKE THESE:

- “What colour is this?”
- “Can you find red?”
- “That’s right, the ball is blue!”
- “What colour is your top?”
- “Green is my favourite colour.”
- “What colours do you like?”
- “I like how you are doing great listening.”

NOTE:

- You can swap with your child and get them to ask you to find colours around the house.

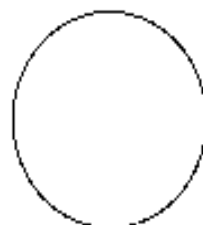

Instructions:

1. Find 2 things that are blue
2. Find 1 thing that is black
3. Find 3 red things and 1 green thing
4. Find 2 green things
5. Find 1 purple thing
6. How many yellow things can you see in this room?
7. Find 1 thing that is pink
8. Find 4 things that are white
9. Find 2 things that are grey
10. Find something orange
